

What we mean by mentoring?

Mentoring programmes match a child with a mentor and encourage them to meet regularly.

These programs aim to help the child form a good relationship with a positive role model.

This relationship could help the child to develop social skills, form constructive relationships with others, or develop positive behaviours and aspirations
